## COURSE INDICATORS/SUFFIXES:

"GE" or "@"/"UT" or any combination of the following: A1-4, B1-2, C1-3, D1-3, E1 indicates an approved General Education course  
"ET" or "E" indicates an Ethnic Studies course  
"NW" or "N" indicates a Northwestern Studies course  
"H" indicates an honors course  
"W" following a course title indicates an advanced writing proficiency (WP) course which requires a prerequisite screening test. Students must pass a WP course in each major with a C- or better to meet the CSU Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement.  
"JAN" or "<>" indicates the course was taken during January intersession  
"NONBACC/REMEDIAL" indicates a remedial nonbaccalaureate course  
"AUDIT" indicates student elected AUDIT grading in lieu of course grading method  
"CR/N" or "CREDIT/NOCREDIT" indicates CR/NC grading option elected in lieu of letter grade.

**ACADEMIC PROBATION AND DISQUALIFICATION:** Academic probation is noted on the academic record when the cumulative or institutional grade point average falls below a 2.00. Academic Disqualification is noted on the academic record when the cumulative or institutional grade point average or grade point deficiency meets disqualification standards.

**ADMINISTRATIVE-ACADEMIC PROBATION AND DISQUALIFICATION:** Effective November 1978, determined by an administrative decision based on several factors, primarily repeated failure to progress toward a stated degree or program objective.

**ADMINISTRATIVE DISQUALIFICATION:** An administrative decision based on student not complying with English/Math remediation requirements.

**RCE:** Courses offered by Regional and Continuing Education are considered residence credit unless noted as extension and REX (Resident Extension Program).
