All course work taken prior to the fall 1987 semester will remain as a South Orange County Community College District transcript. The District transcript reflects courses taken at Irvine Valley College and Saddleback College.

Effective with the fall 1987 semester, Irvine Valley College and Saddleback College were authorized to issue separate transcripts for courses taken at each institution. These transcripts will reflect separate cumulative grade point averages.

Full-time enrollment is 12 or more units. The Associate Degree is conferred upon completion of at least 60 transferable units with a minimum 2.0 grade point average. The degree has specific course requirements available in the Irvine Valley College catalog.
