HISTORY - Glendale Community College was founded in 1927 to serve the needs of the people in the Glendale Union High School District. The school was founded as Glendale Junior College. In 1944, the name was changed to Glendale College. In 1971, the college was renamed to Glendale Community College.

ACCREDITATION - Glendale Community College is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.

CALENDAR - Glendale Community College operates under a semester calendar consisting of two 16-week semesters. Summer and winter session classes have hours, which are equivalent to the semester classes.

AUTHENTICATION OF RECORD - A transcript is official when it bears the facsimile signature of the Director of Admissions and Records and is dated. Computerized records and cumulative totals begin the summer intersession of 1991. Transcripts of credit reflecting course work completed prior to summer 1991 will be an official photocopy of the permanent record.

CHANGE IN FORMAT - Due to programming changes, all external transcript units and grade point averages have been deleted from GCC totals. However, historical academic standing has been preserved.

CSU GE - California State University General Education. The CSU General Education enables a student to fulfill the lower division GE requirements to any California State University. The code is specific to the breadth certification pattern and consists of 39 units. A student may earn partial or full certification.

IGETC - Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum. The IGETC enables a student to fulfill the lower division GE requirements to either the California State University system or the University of California system. The code is specific to IGETC certification pattern and consists of 37 to 39 units.

SCHOLARS PROGRAM - This program offers an enriched academic experience for academically accomplished students. To earn the President's Scholar notation, a student must complete the required Scholars classes, maintain a 3.0 or better, and complete at least 60 transferable units.

ALPHA GAMMA SIGMA - AGS is a California State honor organization. The purpose is to encourage and recognize scholarship on the community college level. Membership requires a cumulative 3.0 GPA.
