**PROBATION**

Probation is assigned after 12 attempted units below a 2.0 Cumulative GPA. Continued Probation is assigned after two consecutive semesters below a Cumulative 2.0 GPA. Dismissal is assigned for a GPA below 2.0, after two consecutive semesters.
