### Understanding Nursing Students' Needs

### Academic Rigor

o Nursing programs are competitive. Prerequisite coursework demands high GPA

### Life Balance

Students Juggle academic with time management, family, self-care

### **Financial Strain**

Costs include program fees and living expenses



### Academic Rigor

### Time Management

- · Class schedule and examples
- Submitting required documents (Castlebranch, background, immunizations)

### Educational planning

- Pathways to Nursing
- Mindful of load for student
- Plan accordingly

### Transfer Preparation

- Plan Ahead: Research transfer requirements early to avoid last-minute stress
- Stay Organized: Keep track of prerequisites, deadlines, and application materials.
- Seek Resources: Utilize transfer counselors and workshops offered by your community
- Transfer Centers: Connect with your transfer center. Have Reps come for Transfer Fairs

### Mindset and Resilience

- Stay Positive: Focus on your long-term goals and remind yourself why you chose this path.
- Celebrate Small Wins: Acknowledge your progress, no matter how small.
- Ask for Help: Don't hesitate to seek support if you're struggling academically or personally.



### Life Balance

### Self-Care

- Physical Health: Get enough sleep, eat nutritious meals, and exercise regularly to maintain energy and focus.
- Mental Health: Practice mindfulness, meditation, or deep breathing to manage stress.
- Take Breaks: Schedule short breaks during study sessions to recharge.

### **Support Systems**

- Family and Friends: Communicate your needs and schedule to loved ones for emotional support.
- Peer Networks: Connect with classmates for study groups and mutual encouragement.
- Faculty and Advisors: Seek guidance from instructors or academic advisors when feeling overwhelmed.



### **Financial Strain**

### Tuition and Fees

- Community College Affordability: The cost advantage of starting at a community college compared to a four-year institution.
- Payment Plans: Many colleges offer installment plans to spread out tuition payments over time.
- Hidden Costs: Budget for additional expenses like textbooks, uniforms, lab fees, and clinical supplies.

### Financial Aid

- FAFSA: Encourage students to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to access grants, loans, and work-study opportunities.
- Grants: Pell Grants and state-specific grants (e.g., Cal Grants) are free money that doesn't need to be repaid.
- Scholarships: Research nursing-specific scholarships through your college, professional organizations, and private foundations.

### Work-Study and Part-Time Jobs

- On-Campus Jobs: Look for work-study positions that accommodate your class schedule.
- Flexible Employment: Consider part-time jobs in healthcare settings (e.g., CNA, medical scribe) to gain experience while earning money.
- Time Management: Balance work hours with academic responsibilities to avoid burnout.



### Financial Need Cont.

### **Transfer-Specific Financial Planning**

- Research Transfer Costs: Understand the tuition and fees at your target four-year institution.
- Articulation Agreements: Take advantage of transfer agreements that ensure your credits apply, saving time and money.
- Transfer Scholarships: Many universities offer scholarships specifically for transfer students.

### **Additional Resources**

- Financial Literacy Workshops: Attend workshops offered by your college to learn about budgeting, saving, and managing debt.
- Nursing Program Support: Some nursing programs have emergency funds or grants for students facing financial hardships.
- Community Resources: Explore local nonprofits or organizations that provide financial assistance to students.

### Nursing Prerequisites

Required Prerequisites for RN Examination and Endorsement Applicants

California Code of Regulations Section 1426 identifies the prerequisite courses required in addition to a nursing program:

Communication skills, six (6) semester or nine (9) quarter units shall include principals of:

- Oral communication
- Written communication
- Group communication

Related natural sciences, sixteen (16) semester or twenty-four (24) quarter units shall include:

- Anatomy with lab
- Physiology with lab
- Microbiology with lab
- Behavioral sciences (Psychology)
- Social sciences

### **TEAS** Preparation

The ATI TEAS exam is comprised of 170 total questions, with 209 minutes in allocated testing time. Questions consist of: Reading, Math, Science, English & Language usage.

# Concurrent Enrollment Program (CEP) Overview

- Concurrent Enrollment Programs allow students to be enrolled at a community college Associate's in Nursing program and university Bachelor's of Science in Nursing program simultaneously
- · Benefits:
  - Can accelerate the completion of a BSN program
  - Theory complements skills learned in an Associate's in Nursing program
  - Provides access to a larger support network
- Challenges
  - ADN and BSN schedule overlap
  - May become very difficult to manage multiple roles and responsibilities if time management skills are not good
  - Financial Aid may be limited for some programs
