EXPLANATION OF TRANSCRIPT OF RECORD

ACCREDITATION:

California State University, Stanislaus is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. Individual programs are accredited by: Art Department: NASAD (National Association of Schools of Art and Design); Computer Science Department: Computing Sciences Accrediting Board; Chemistry Department: American Chemical Society; Music Department: National Association of Schools of Music; Nursing Department: NLN (National League of Nursing); Public Administration: NASPAA (National Association of Schools of Public Affairs and Administration); Drama Department: NAST (National Association of Schools of Theatre); School of Education: CTC (California Commission on Teacher Credentialing) and NCATE (National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education).

CALENDAR:

In September 1973, the University adopted a 4-1-4 calendar which provides for a 13-week Fall semester, a one-month Winter Term and a 13-week Spring semester. From 1960 through Summer 1965, the University operated on the semester system, each semester being approximately 16 weeks in length. In September, 1965, the University converted to the quarter system, each quarter being approximately 11 weeks in length. Beginning with the 1973 Summer Session, the University returned to the semester system.

*All credit earned by students possessing a Baccalaureate Degree is recognized as postbaccalaureate work. Applicability of graduate credit to a graduate or postbaccalaureate objective is determined by the evaluating authority for each program. Last semester seniors within 9 semester credits of graduation who have obtained the proper approvals may enroll for postbaccalaureate credit. A notation on the transcript will indicate which courses carry postbaccalaureate credit.

UNITS OR CREDITS: A semester unit represents 750 minutes of lecture or recitation, or 1,500 minutes of laboratory for a minimum of 13 weeks.

REPEATED COURSES: The University allows undergraduates to repeat courses; some academic departments require that some courses be repeated until a grade higher than a "D" is earned. When a course is repeated, the G.P.A. is computed by using the last grade received. All entries remain a part of the student's permanent academic record. A notation indicating the repeated course will appear on the transcript.

CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS (C.E.U.): Credit recorded for subject matter training that is not applicable to an academic program. One C.E.U. is awarded for every 10 hours of instruction.

TRANSCRIPT VALIDATION: An official transcript is printed on secure paper, does not require a raised seal, and is valid only when it bears the signature of the Director of Admissions and Records.

NOTE: Official transcript of records dated before Fall 1988 may be black and white and will have the raised seal of California State University, Stanislaus.
