

**HISTORY**

Butte College was established in 1967. This college is accredited by the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.

CREDIT

Butte College was on the Quarter system through Summer 1985. Beginning Fall 1985, the Semester system is in effect.

COURSE NUMBERS

Prior to Fall 1985, will require inspection of appropriate catalog. Beginning Fall 1985 the course numbering system is as follows:

- 1-99 Courses recommended for transfer to the CSU System. Certain courses 1-99 may transfer to the UC System and Private Colleges and Universities.
- 100-199 Courses recommended for the Associate Degree only.

REPEATED COURSES

In most instances when a substandard grade ("D", "F", or "NP") is assigned, and is repeated, the most recent grade will be used to compute the grade point average. In some instances a substandard grade may not be alleviated (see CCR T5 §55042[c]). If a course for which a satisfactory grade ("A", "B", "C", OR "P") has been recorded is repeated, the new grade is not counted in computing the grade point average (exceptions are made for courses designated as repeatable in accordance with CCR T5 §55041 [d]). Prior to Fall 1981, repeated grades were averaged in computing the grade point average.

INCOMPLETE GRADES

Effective Fall 1981, an incomplete grade will be changed to a letter grade if the incomplete is not cleared within one calendar year.

WITHDRAWAL GRADE

Beginning Summer 2012, if a student withdraws from a class during the first two weeks of a semester or first 20% of an irregular term class, neither the course nor the grade will appear on the student's record. If a student withdraws from a class between week three through thirteen or 75% of an irregular term, a "W" grade will be assigned. Under certain circumstances, a "W" grade may be assigned after week thirteen.
