California State University, East Bay was established in 1957 as State College for Alameda County. In 1963 the name was changed to California State College at Hayward, in 1968, to California State College, Hayward, in 1972, to California State University, Hayward, and in 2005, to California State University, East Bay. Cal State East Bay is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges, the agency which grants national accreditation to colleges and universities in the Western United States.

CALENDAR SYSTEM

Cal State East Bay operated on the quarter system through Summer 2018. Effective Fall 2018, California State University East Bay operates on a semester system, which is supplemented by summer (10 weeks) and winter (2 weeks) intersessions. All credit hours displayed on the transcript are reported using the calendar system in effect at the time of course completion. A conversion summary is provided where the transcript carries both quarter and semester credit hours. Unit conversion is calculated by multiplying the total quarter units by 0.66667 and truncating the product at three decimal places.

Regardless of the format transcripts must bear the official seal of the University to be considered official.
