Symbols of + (**plus**) or – (**minus**) do not affect grade points in this District prior to Fall 2013 semester. Effective Fall 2013 term, they do affect grade points. The symbol, #, identifies non-degree applicable courses effective Spring 2008 term. Prior to Spring 2008 refer to college catalog to identify courses that are non-degree applicable.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA) KEY

- Total Institution: Includes SMCCCD degree-applicable course grades only.
- Total Transfer: Includes degree-applicable course earned units accepted from other institutions.
- Overall Earned Units combines Total Institution Earned Units and Total Transfer Earned Units.
- Overall GPA Units, Overall Points and Overall GPA reflect SMCCCD degree-applicable course grades only with the exception of non-degree applicable courses taken before Spring 2008.

A GPA is listed for each term; cumulative totals are at the end of the transcript. EUnits represent the total units earned for degree and non-degree applicable courses for a term. The GPA is determined by dividing the total number of grade points (see Pts:) by the total number of GPA units. An **E** in the right column indicates the course is excluded from the GPA and Pts. totals.

HONORS

Honors are granted upon completion of the Associate in Arts and Associate in Science degrees. The level of honors granted is determined by the grade point average earned in all lower division degree-applicable college work attempted according to the following scale:

- Cum laude 3.30 – 3.49
- Magna cum laude 3.50 – 3.99
- Summa cum laude 4.0
